Examination Policy

1. Eligibility Criteria

- Foundation Course: Candidates must have passed Class 12 or equivalent examination.
- Intermediate Course: Candidates must have passed the CMA Foundation exam or have an equivalent qualification (such as graduation in any discipline other than fine arts).
 - Final Course: Candidates must have passed the CMA Intermediate exam.

Additional educational qualifications must align with ICMAI's guidelines.

2. Examination Phases

The CMA exam is conducted in three stages:

- Foundation Course
- Intermediate Course
- Final Course

Each phase has its own syllabus and requirements. Candidates can only proceed to the next level after successfully clearing the previous stage.

3. Examination Frequency

- The CMA exams are conducted twice a year: in June and December.
- The exam schedule is announced on the official ICMAI website, including important dates for registration, admit card availability, and result declaration.

4. Mode of Examination

- The exams are held online and/or offline, depending on the region and availability of resources.
- The question paper consists of multiple-choice questions (MCQs) for the Foundation level and a combination of MCQs and descriptive questions for Intermediate and Final levels.

5. Examination Centres

- ICMAI designates specific centres for the offline mode of exams.
- The allocation of the centre will be on a first-come, first-served basis, and candidates are advised to register early to secure their preferred locations.

6. Admit Card

- Candidates must download their admit cards from the ICMAI portal.
- The admit card includes the exam schedule, venue, and instructions for the candidates.
- Entry into the examination hall is strictly prohibited without the admit card and valid ID proof.

7. Examination Rules

- Reporting Time: Candidates must report to the examination centre 30 minutes before the exam.
- Late Entry: No candidate will be allowed to enter the exam hall 15 minutes after the commencement of the examination.
- Identification: Candidates must carry a valid photo ID (Aadhar, Passport, etc.) along with their admit card.
- Prohibited Items: Use of mobile phones, calculators (except those allowed for specific papers), electronic gadgets, and unauthorized notes is strictly forbidden.
- Dress Code: Candidates should dress modestly and appropriately for the examination environment.

8. Exam Duration

- Each paper is of 3 hours duration.
- Candidates are allowed to leave the examination hall only after the first hour.

9. Malpractice and Penalties

- Any form of cheating, impersonation, or use of unfair means will result in the immediate disqualification of the candidate.
- The candidate may be banned from appearing in future exams and subject to further disciplinary action.

10. Examination Results

- Results are generally announced within 8-10 weeks after the completion of the exams.
- Results can be accessed through the ICMAI official website using the candidate's registration number.

11. Re-evaluation and Scrutiny

- Candidates who are dissatisfied with their marks may apply for verification of answer scripts.
- Re-evaluation is limited to checking for any omissions in marking and totalling errors.

12. Passing Criteria

- To pass, candidates must secure a minimum of 40% marks in each subject and an aggregate of 50% in all subjects.

13. Examination Fee

- The examination fee varies depending on the level of the course.
- Payment must be made online through the ICMAI portal by the specified deadline.
